Now in the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a city of Galilee named Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. And having come in, the angel said to her, "Rejoice, highly favored one, the Lord is with you; blessed are you among women!"

But when she saw him, she was troubled at his saying, and considered what manner of greeting this was. Then the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bring forth a Son, and shall call His name Jesus. He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Highest; and the Lord God will give Him the throne of His father David. And He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of His kingdom there will be no end."

Then Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I do not know a man?" And the angel answered and said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Highest will overshadow you; therefore, also, that Holy One who is to be born will be called the Son of God. Mighty Mississippi! It begins a journey that goes for 2340 miles and empties into the Gulf of Mexico. Along the way, it gathers water that is the watershed for huge areas of the USA. By the time it reaches New Orleans, it is the second largest river in the world!

God's great plan of Salvation, the opportunity to be forgiven of our sins, and to enter eternity with Him when we die, had such humble beginnings. This passage of Scripture tells us about a young lady who did not understand totally what was being asked of her. She was troubled, and the angel had to calm her fears.

Small beginnings for a plan that would save billions of God's Children. She would give birth to the Son of God, Who would establish His throne. Those who studies the Scriptures understood what this meant, but to this young lady it meant that she would receive a miracle from God, and His Son would be her Son.

How could this possibly be? Only because with God all things are possible. The great and mighty river of God's grace was going to begin with one young lady. Would she be willing?
